Replaces Chapter Achievement Award

New ROSE Awards File Available



The ROSE (Recognition of Society Excellence) Awards document, listing the guidelines for recognition of chapters' annual work, is now available on the NC DKG website. This <u>file</u> replaces the former Chapter Achievement Award.

The ROSE Award has two levels—the Rose Bud Award, symbolic of a young rose whose petals are not yet fully opened, and the Order of the Rose Award for chapters wholly involved in DKG work. Chapters need to complete ten of the 12 options in the Rose Bud Award category for recognition. Most of the items are standard DKG work, such as completing forms or reports and participating in NC DKG events. There are five categories of participation for the Order of the Rose Award, and chapters need to check off 25 items they have completed in addition to the first ten in the Rose Bud Award.

The ROSE Awards are non-competitive and are meant to be guides for chapters to gauge their annual work. NC DKG President Beth Winstead praised the Awards Committee work, saying, "The committee has provided chapters a roadmap of how to have a strong, successful chapter with involvement from all members." Awards Committee members working on the new awards document are Amy White, chair, Connie Marks, Elaine McRae, Meghan Wilder, and Jean Yelverton.

At the Convention in Asheville,




bottles began their journey. The bottles, a project of the NC DKG Educational Foundation, are traveling all across our state. When you find one...
