From the Kitchen...

Grilled Chicken Pita Salad

2 boned, skinned chicken breast halves 2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice ½ tsp. Freshly ground black pepper ½ c. pitted kalamata olives 4 oz. block feta cheese, broken in chunks 2 c. halved grape tomatoes 2 c. loosely packed baby arugula

6 Tbsp. Extra-virgin olive oil 1 Tbsp. fresh oregano leaves 1 bunch asparagus (trimmed, cut in half lengthwise)

2 c. pita chips

Prepare charcoal or gas grill for high heat (450 to 550 degrees; you can hold your hand 5 in. above cooking grate only 2 to 4 seconds). Coat chicken breasts with 1 tbsp. oil and cook, turning once, until no longer pink in the center and grill marks appear, about 7 minutes total. Let rest 10 minutes, then slice.

Meanwhile, in a small bowl, whisk lemon juice, ½ cup oil, oregano, and pepper; set aside. Bring medium pot of salted water to a boil, drop in asparagus, and cook until bright green, about 2 minutes. Drain and rinse thoroughly with cold water.

In a medium bowl, combine chicken, cheese, asparagus, tomatoes, olives and pita chips. Pour reserved dressing over mixture and toss gently to coat. Add arugula and toss once more to combine.
